

Member Services—Meets the 4th Sunday of month.


New Members—Meets last Sunday of the month.

Do You Want to Be a Leader?

People in this fellowship have frequently talked about starting a discussion group about death, but no one has actually done it.

We all know how sometimes death can come unexpectedly and suddenly, and how at other times death can be a lingering and sometimes painful experience. Perhaps now is the time to start the discussion.

There is a new resource for such a discussion. *Before You Die* is a 32-page collection of reflections and resources—both practical and spiritual—that talks about death with sensitivity, directness, and even a touch of humor. It was compiled by pastors and writers from the United Church of Christ, a progressive denomination that shares many values with UUism.

The book has chapters such as *I'm* dying and No One Will Let Me Talk About It and Cremation vs. Burial; a funeral planning list; and suggested scripture readings and hymns. The book costs \$6.50 for a single copy but only \$3.00 each for larger quantities.




Religious Education Classes
